#### 6. Reports from Staff & Others

a. Road Department Report

The Roads Superintendent reports that Plow Truck 19 is back in service. New clutch brake and clutch were repaired under warranty. Winter operations have begun. The Superintendent reminds residents that as per the Highway Traffic Act, no one is permitted to push snow across the roadways at any time. The gate and "No Trespassing" signs are missing from the Wabi Pit and will be replaced to be compliant with aggregate regulations. Staff will make the necessary repairs to the gate and installations of required signage, which have been ordered. Boundaries need to be marked out and staff may need to hire someone to assist with boundary demarcations. Lastly, the cemetery clean up of trees, shrubs etc. did not occur this year as planned and is rescheduled for next season.

b. Fire Department Report

The Fire Chief reports that there were no calls in the month of November. Fire Chief Lenover asked staff to look into the ENR By-Law to see if it includes interior attack. Certification was discussed at their last meeting. The Department will work towards completing this in the new year. One individual would like to join the Department. Chief Lenover and Josh Dufresne attended the Emergency Table Top exercise in Earlton on November 15<sup>th</sup>.

WHEREAS police services in Ontario do not currently have the legal tools to
penalize the dangerous maneuver of vehicles passing vehicular traffic on the

left on two solid yellow lines;

**AND WHEREAS** this dangerous maneuver has had devastating effects on the residents of Northern Ontario Municipalities which center around Highways 11 and 17, and who must use these highways as main thoroughfares;

**AND WHEREAS** Guy Bourgouin, MPP Mushkegowuk-James Bay, is preparing a bill to make it completely illegal for a vehicle to pass on the left side of a lane when it is marked with two solid yellow lines;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Kerns, hereby resolves to support the initiative of MPP Bourgouin in the preparation of this very important bill. "CARRIED"

b. Municipality of Wawa – Bill C-310 – Support Tax Credit Firefighter

WHEREAS Canada has 90,000 volunteer firefighters who provide fire and all hazard emergency services to their communities; in addition, approximately 8,000 essential search and rescue volunteers respond to thousands of incidents every year; and

WHEREAS many of these individuals receive some form of pay on call, an honorarium, or are given some funding to cover expenses, but they do not draw a living wage from firefighting; and

WHEREAS without volunteer firefighters and search and rescue volunteers, thousands of communities in Canada would have no fire and emergency response coverage; and

WHEREAS in 2013, the federal government initiated a tax credit recognizing these individuals, and calling on the federal government to increase this tax credit from \$3,000 to \$10,000; and

WHEREAS volunteer firefighters account for 71% of Canada's total firefighting essential first responders;

- The tax code of Canada currently allows volunteer firefighters and search and rescue volunteers to claim a \$3,000 tax credit if 200 hours of volunteer services were completed in a calendar year;
- This works out to a mere \$450 per year, which we allow these essential volunteers to keep of their own income from their regular jobs, \$2.25 an hour;
- If they volunteer more than 200 hours, which many do, this tax credit becomes even less;
- These essential volunteers not only put their lives on the line and give their time, training and efforts to Canadians, but they also allow cities and municipalities to keep property taxes lower than if paid services were required;
